

SHOWCASE RE-CAPS: DAY 2

SOUTHERN OREGON 6, WICHITA 0—**Joel Holmberg** scored a hat trick and **Austin Toussaint** turned aside all 19 shots he saw as the Southern Oregon Spartans defeated the Wichita Jr. Thunder, 6-0. **Axel Low** added two more goals for the Spartans and Keegan Randell picked up three assists. Austin Tilton made 30 saves for the Jr. Thunder.

CASPER 2, CPJHL WHITE 1 (OT)—**Bradley Green** scored the game-winning goal in overtime as the Casper Coyotes edged the CPJHL White team, 2-1. **Tyler Arsenault** scored the lone goal of the first half 7:42 into the game to give the CPJHL the lead. There was only one goal in the second half as well—that by Casper's **Eric Hambling**. Coyotes netminder **Wesley Ellingson** allowed just one goal on 28 shots. CPJHL goalie **Cedric Lesieur** entered the game in relief in the first half and made 17 saves. **Andrew Williamson** assisted on both Casper goals.

WEST SOUND 6, FRESNO 3—The West Sound Warriors scored five times in the first half and cruised to a 6-3 win over the Fresno Monsters. **Connor Wherrett** scored 30 seconds after the opening puck drop to set the tone for the first half. He added another with just under five minutes left in the half and completed the hat trick in the second half. **Ty-Andrew Traynor** picked up three assists in the game for the Warriors and **Robbie Brennan** made 19 saves. **Deivids Tempelmanis** scored two goals for Fresno.

PHOENIX 8, SEATTLE 4—**Anthony Masanotti** scored three goals and **Zachary Kowalchuk** added a pair to lead the Phoenix Knights to an 8-4 win over the Seattle Totems. Phoenix led, 3-1, at halftime, but **Tyler Goclan** scored just 43 seconds into the second half to get the Totems within a goal. Masanotti responded with his second of the night a minute and a half later, however, and the Knights quelled the Seattle comeback attempt. **Naoki Onondera** went the distance in the Seattle net, making 44 saves.

TAHOE 2, CPJHL RED 1 (OT)—**Nick Davidow** scored both goals for the Tahoe—the second one coming in overtime—to lead the Icemen to a 2-1 win over the CPJHL Red Team. CPJHL player **Cody Thompson** scored with three minutes left in regulation to force the tie, beating Tahoe goaltender **Maximilian Haselbacher**, who stopped 20 of 21 shots in the game. WSHL veteran **Paul Frys** assisted on both of Davidow's goals.

ONTARIO 3, SPRINGFIELD 2 (OT)—The Ontario Avalanche let a two-goal slip away in the third period, but **Henrik Lohman's** overtime goal made a winner out of the Avalanche, 3-2, over the Springfield Express. Ontario entered the final 10 minutes of the second half with a 2-0 lead, but **Vegard Faret** scored twice for Springfield in a span of 2:42 and the game went to sudden-death. **Connor Duffy** stopped all 15 shots he faced in the first half and, despite letting a couple get past him to tie it, made 32 saves— including a pair in overtime—to get the "W" for the Avs. **Chad Purdy** made 27 saves for the Express—16 of them in the second half.

UTAH 6, LONG BEACH 3—The Utah Outliers had leads of 2-0 and 3-1 in the first half, but Long Beach came back to tie it, 3-3, on **Parker Moskal**'s second goal of the half. **Roman Cvik** gave Utah the lead back, and the Outliers scored the only two goals of the second half for a 6-3 win. **Kane Toriumi** scored twice for the Bombers. The Outliers out-shot Long Beach, 20-6, in the second half and **Dawson Rodin** stopped all six shots, finishing the game with 21 saves. **Domenic Bosetti** made 39 saves for Long Beach.

EL PASO 4, OGDEN 2—The El Paso Rhinos bounced back from their first loss of the season and kept Ogden off the board for the first 44:22 of the game before setting for a 4-2 win. El Paso's **Donald Alchin, Jr.** scored 1:42 into the game and that was the only goal of the first half. The first 14:23 of the second half went by without any scoring either, until **Colby Haugen** doubled the Rhinos lead. When **Cole Richardson** made it 3-0 with 7:30 left, it seemingly put the game away for El Paso, but the Mustangs ruined **Filip Krasanovsky**'s shutout bid when **Jacob Laurin** finally put Ogden on the board with 5:38 remaining. **Bryson Bartell** got the Mustangs within a goal with 1:50 left, but **Cole Dubecky** responded for Ogden just 43 seconds later to seal the 4-2 win. **Daniel Pavlicko** stopped 23 of 24 shots in the first half to keep Ogden in the game, and finished with 32 saves in all.

COLORADO 4, VALENCIA 1—**Carter Dahl** scored twice and **Braden Lajoie** stopped 24 of 25 shots as the Colorado Jr. Eagles defeated the Valencia Flyers, 4-1. The Flyers didn't solve Lajoie until the final minute of the game when **Nickolai Gruzdev** finally got one past him. **Vincent Mastrandrea** assisted on both of Dahl's goals and scored one himself as well. Valencia netminder **Spencer Kozlowski** made 34 saves.

BELLINGHAM 6, DALLAS 2—Bellingham jumped out to a 5-0 lead in the first half and cruised to a 6-2 win over the Dallas Snipers. **Ruslan Novruzov** notched a hat trick and added an assist while Ilya Abubakirov scored a goal and set up a pair. **Trevor Borlace** and **Taner Byrd** lit the lamp for the Snipers.

OKLAHOMA CITY 2, IDAHO 1—Oklahoma City Blazers goaltender **Bobby Cloutier** allowed just one of 34 shots to get past him, backstopping OKC to a 2-1 win over the Idaho IceCats. **Jackson York** tied the game, 1-1, 9:27 into the second period, but **Jordan Sgro** scored just 2:35 later to put the Blazers back ahead.

CPJHL WHITE 3, SUPERIOR 2—**Felix Stephen** scored his second goal of the game with 3:14 left to give the CPJHL White Team a 3-2 win over the Superior RoughRiders. Superior came back to tie after the CPJHL squad went ahead 1-0 and 2-1, but could not come back a third time. **Thore Weyrauch** and **Alexander Holt** found the net for the RoughRiders.

SAN DIEGO 4, CHEYENNE 1—The Cheyenne Stampede broke the ice, but the San Diego Sabers went on to a 4-1 win. **Patrick Henson** kept the Sabers in the game by stopping 24 of 25 shots in the first half. **Ben Greenlee** played the second half and stopped seven shots. Four different players scored for San Diego, including **Karel Kankovsky**, who also had two assists.
